

Critical 2017 Dates for Seniors

College application and selection season has kicked-off. Lots of activities; and lots of dates to keep track of...To help make parents aware of all the activities, and the deadlines their students have on their plate, we have created a timeline. We hope this is helpful resource for you in the process.

First day to file a FAFSA form

October 1st

FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) forms are available with the U.S. Department of Education. Visit <u>fafsa.ed.gov</u> for assistance. Before filing your FAFSA, you need to establish an FSA ID for the student and one of the parents. Setup your ID at <u>fsaid.ed.gov</u>

Early Decision Filing (dates vary for each college)

November 1st

Students electing to file for a "Early Decision" may select one university. This represents a college that you intend to accept admission, if the financial aid package is considered adequate. You will receive an admission decision in December. A nonrefundable deposit is expected well in advance of May 1st.

Early Action Filing (varies for each college)

November 1st - December 1st

Early Action accelerates the admission decision by the University (usually in January or February). You must give the college a decision no later than May 1st. You may apply to other colleges under regular admission plans.

FAFSA Deadlines for Early Decisions/Early Action

December 1st

Many Early Decision and Early Action schools request these students to file FAFSA before the year end. December 1st is the most common date but we encourage parents to be aware of particular school deadlines, which can be as early as November 1. Many of these schools will require you to file the CSS Profile in addition to the FAFSA, so be aware of the requirements for each school. Application Deadlines

February 1st

Those pursuing the standard freshman application generally want to have their applications in by early February. Many universities have rolling admissions, however, students seeking matriculation in competitive environments want to be in the process by November. Colleges are eager to know what their entering freshman class looks like. This also affords the student time to influence competitive offers and maximize financial assistance.

Common FAFSA Deadlines March 1st

The official FAFSA filing deadline for Fall 2018 school year is June 30th, 2019, however this is only for financial aid directly from the Federal Government. If you need university gifting and seek to leverage competitive offers it is advantageous to have filed the FAFSA form in the early part of the year. Universities typically begin to make financial awards during this month. Check with each school's website for their Priority Filing Deadline and don't be late! If you are filing Early Decision some schools may want your FAFSA (and Profile application, if applicable) by November 1, so check with the schools for their requirements.
